Subject: FY 2019-2020 Youth Arts Enrichment Program Grant Award Recommendations

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Council approve the funding of 31 grants for a total of \$500,000.00 from the FY 2019-2020 Youth Arts Enrichment Program.

BACKGROUND

The FY 2019-2020 Youth Arts Enrichment Program (YEP) Grants Panel, chaired by Mireille Chancy-Gonzalez convened on July 11, 2019 to review 32 applications requesting a total of \$633,330.00. The Panel recommended funding 31 applications for a total of \$500,000.00. One (1) application scored below the threshold established by the Panel and was not recommended for funding.

YEP was created as a joint initiative of the Miami-Dade County Department of Cultural Affairs and The Children's Trust. The objective of the YEP Grants Program is to enrich the lives of children through the arts by making the arts available to more children and families throughout Miami-Dade County, whereby children will have opportunities to have positive live arts experiences through:

- Arts Instruction
- Arts Intervention
- Healing/Expressive Arts
- In-school Arts Residencies and Performances
- Out-of-School/Public Arts Exhibitions and Performances

Applicants to this program must have a minimum two-year track record of providing high quality, cultural arts programs for children and/or youth. Units of government and educational institutions such as schools, colleges and universities may not apply.

YEP is structured into three funding categories:

CATEGORY A: Provides project-based funding support to non-profit organizations for projects that provide children and youth the opportunity for ongoing/long-term direct participation in the arts, such as sequential arts instruction, after-school arts programs, in-school arts residency programs, etc. These projects must be able to measure the impact of repeated participation in these programs on the students over the project period. **Applicants in Category A may request up to \$30,000.**

CATEGORY B: Provides project-based funding support to non-profit organizations for arts enrichment experiences for children and youth. **Applicants in Category B may request \$10,000.**

CATEGORY C: Provides project-based funding support to non-profit organizations for projects that serve children, youth and young adults with disabilities through inclusive arts and cultural programs so that kids of all abilities and their families can participate fully in the arts. **Applicants in Category C may request up to \$20,000.**

The Panel specifically evaluated each applicant organization based on the following competitive review criteria: 1) impact, 2) artistic merit, 3) management and financial capability, and 4) reach, giving priority attention to: projects that address children whose ability to participate in such programs may be limited by geography, economics or disability; and projects that provide children and youth the opportunity for ongoing/long-term direct participation in the arts.

Attached is a list describing the projects recommended for funding.

Funding for the YEP program is derived from the FY 2019-2020 grant awarded to the Department by The Children's Trust. All funding recommendations are contingent upon approval of the Department of Cultural Affairs' FY 2019-2020 budget by the Miami-Dade County Board of County Commissioners and Mayor, and are subject to the availability of funds.

Grant funds will be used to support the third year of Arts Ballet goes to Ojus Elementary School for 40 students ages PreK to 5th Grade, at Ojus Elementary School in North Miami for a resident program of 22 weeks. Children will learn the basics of ballet and other dance styles. The program includes an introduction to ballet appreciation, the theory of dance, ballet vocabulary, and Russian ballet style.

Grant funds will be used to support Arts Beyond the Classroom (ABC) program for 300 students ages 5-17, October 1, 2019 -May 22, 2020 at Gibson Bethel Community Center, Mt. Olive Baptist Church in South Miami CRA and at Miami Bridge and Chapman Partnership in Homestead. Project activities will include classes, workshops, mural-making and field-trips. Participants will engage in visual arts, music and dance and benefit from 2D and 3D design, assemblage, drawing, painting, singing, dancing and playing instruments.

Project activities will include music, singing and playing little percussion instruments. Participants will engage in music and benefit from songs with percussion instruments. All grant funds are used for activities that occur in Miami-Dade County.

Grant funds will be used to support expansion of The Short Cuts Tour to 30,000 students in middle and high schools during the 2019-2020 school year at schools and service organizations throughout Miami-Dade County. Project activities include free performances in the schools/at the centers featuring 10-minute plays created specifically for these age groups. Participants will engage in pre- and post-performance classroom activities. For many, the Tour provides their first exposure to live theater.

Project activities will include twice-weekly harmony classes, instrument coaching, and jam sessions. Participants will explore unique musical ideas, and benefit from skills that create freedom of expression over many styles, to build well-rounded musicians for today's varied performance demands.
