Subject: FY 2022-2023 Youth Arts Enrichment Program Grant Award Recommendations

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Council approve the funding of 29 grants for a total of \$550,000.00 from the FY 2022-2023 Youth Arts Enrichment Program.

BACKGROUND

The FY 2022-2023 Youth Arts Enrichment Program (YEP) Grants Panel, chaired by Mireille Chancy-Gonzalez convened on September 8, 2022 to review 32 applications requesting a total of \$615,820.00. The Panel recommended funding 29 applications for a total of \$550,000.00. Three (3) applications scored below the threshold established by the Panel and were not recommended for funding.

YEP was created as a joint initiative of the Miami-Dade County Department of Cultural Affairs and The Children's Trust. The objective of the YEP Grants Program is to enrich the lives of children through the arts by making the arts available to more children and families throughout Miami-Dade County, whereby children will have opportunities to have positive live arts experiences through:

- Arts Instruction
- Arts Intervention
- Healing/Expressive Arts
- In-school Arts Residencies and Performances
- Out-of-School/Public Arts Exhibitions and Performances

Applicants to this program must have a minimum one-year track record of providing high quality, cultural arts programs for children and/or youth. Units of government and educational institutions such as schools, colleges and universities may not apply.

YEP is structured into three funding categories:

CATEGORY A: Provides project-based funding support to non-profit organizations for projects that provide children and youth the opportunity for ongoing/long-term direct participation in the arts, such as sequential arts instruction, after-school arts programs, in-school arts residency programs, etc. These projects must be able to measure the impact of repeated participation in these programs on the students over the project period. **Applicants in Category A may request up to \$30,000.**

CATEGORY B: Provides project-based funding support to non-profit organizations for arts enrichment experiences for children and youth. **Applicants in Category B may request \$10,000.**

CATEGORY C: Provides project-based funding support to non-profit organizations for projects that serve children, youth and young adults with disabilities through inclusive arts and cultural programs so that kids of all abilities and their families can participate fully in the arts. **Applicants in Category C may request up to \$20,000.**

The Panel specifically evaluated each applicant organization based on the following competitive review criteria: 1) impact, 2) artistic merit, 3) management and financial capability, and 4) reach, giving priority attention to: projects that address children whose ability to participate in such programs may be limited by geography, economics or disability; and projects that provide children and youth the opportunity for ongoing/long-term direct participation in the arts.

Attached is a list describing the projects recommended for funding.

Funding for the YEP program is derived from the FY 2022-2023 grant awarded to the Department by The Children's Trust. All funding recommendations are contingent upon approval of the Department of Cultural Affairs' FY 2022-2023 budget by the Miami-Dade County Board of County Commissioners and Mayor and are subject to the availability of funds.

Accessing the Arts

Grant funds will be used to support Accessing the Arts for 200 students ages 3-18, October 1, 2022 - May 31, 2023 in ten Miami-Dade County Public Schools. Project activities will include performing arts skills that enhance academic, social, and personal development and growth. Participants will engage in music, drama, and dance, and benefit from rhythmic skill development, ensemble participation, singing, yoga and mindfulness, instrumental experiences, and creative movement.

Arts Ballet goes to School at Ojus Elementary

Grant funds will be used to support the fourth year of Arts Ballet goes to Ojus Elementary School for 40 students in 2nd and 3rd grades, at Ojus Elementary School in Miami for a resident program of 20 weeks. Children will learn the basics of ballet and other dance styles. The program includes an introduction to ballet appreciation, theory of dance, ballet vocabulary, and Russian ballet style.

Arts Beyond the Classroom (ABC)

Grant funds will be used to support 150 students ages 6-15, October 24, 2022 - May 19, 2023 at the Sweet Home Academy in Perrine, Gibson Bethel Community Center in South Miami CRA and Chapman Partnership in Homestead. Project activities will include drawing, painting, dancing, singing and playing musical instruments. Participants will engage in visual arts, music and dance and benefit from learning public performance and art exhibition.

Grant funds will be used to support "Music, Kids & Wellness" for 700 children/students with disabilities ages 0 to 21, October 1, 2022 - May30, 2023 at the Nicklaus Children's Hospital and Miami Learning Experiences School in Miami-Dade County. Project activities will include music, singing and playing percussion instruments. Participants will engage in healing/soothing music and benefit from songs with percussion instruments as well as some some movements and rhythms that promote overall wellbeing. All grant funds are used for activities that occur in Miami-Dade County.

Grant funds will be used to support the "Inheritants" portion of the Dia de los Muertos Celebration and Afro Roots Fest for 60 - 100 families, ages 1 to 18, on October 30, 2022 and at the Doral Yard and April 9, 2023 at the North Beach Bandshell. Project activities include free Afro indigenous workshops such as: a sugar skull station, community ancestral altar, pop up gallery, storytelling, face painting, dance and percussion workshops. Youth will learn about cultural and ancestral celebrations in our community.

Grant funds will be used to support "CAP Miami Jazz Institute Creative Heights" for 100 students ages 10-18, from across Miami-Dade County, October 1, 2022 - May 27, 2023 at Coral Gables Congregational Church. Project activities will include twice-weekly harmony classes, instrument coaching and jam sessions. Participants will explore unique musical ideas, and benefit from skills that create freedom of expression over many styles, to prepare well-rounded musicians for today's varied performance demands.
