FY 2022-23 Youth Arts Miami (YAM) Grants Program Recommendations Subject:

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Council approve the funding of 34 grants from the FY 2022-2023 Youth Arts Miami (YAM) Grants Program.

BACKGROUND

The FY 2022-2023 Youth Arts Miami (YAM) Grants Panel, chaired by Department of Cultural Affairs staff members Gilda Mooney and Dana Pezoldt, convened on Tuesday, May 17, 2022 to review 34 applications requesting a total of \$2,625,000. The Panel recommended funding all 34 applications.

The objective of the Youth Arts Miami (YAM) Grants Program is to provide operational funding support to non-profit youth arts organizations having a year-round presence in Miami-Dade County whose primary mission is to create, present or exhibit cultural programs for children and/or with children. Applicants to this program must have at least a 3-year track record of providing a year-round season of youth arts activities for children and youth. Programs must include public access components such as performances or exhibitions. Units of government and educational institutions such as schools, colleges and universities may not apply.

The YAM program is structured into three funding categories: Category A funds large-sized professional youth arts organizations invited to apply by Department of Cultural Affairs staff and possessing the potential to achieve regional, national or international visibility as evidenced by the organization's current programs and Category B funds mid-sized semi-professional and professional youth arts organizations structure. demonstrating a total prior year's organizational revenues of between \$200,000 and \$500,000. Category C funds small and/or developing youth arts organizations with annual organizational revenues between \$50,000 and \$200,000.

The Panel specifically evaluated each applicant organization based on the following competitive review criteria: 1) impact - efforts to fulfill the youth arts mission of the organization; 2) artistic merit; 3) management, organizational development and financial capability; and 4) reach (ability to reach underserved children and youth who may be limited by geography, economics or disability and impact on and involvement of Miami-Dade's multicultural community). Attached is a list describing the organizations and programs recommended for funding.

The award recommendations will be computed using the established funding formulas for this program. The program's FY 2022-2023 total allocation and the recommended grant award amounts per grantee will be presented to the Council for final review later this summer, after all the Spring cycle grants program panels have convened and preliminary FY 2022-2023 budget numbers are received.

Funding for the Youth Arts Miami (YAM) grant program is derived from departmental proprietary revenues. All funding recommendations are contingent upon approval of the Department of Cultural Affairs' FY 2022-2023 budget by the Miami-Dade County Board of County Commissioners and Mayor and are subject to availability of funds.

Funds are requested to support music education and outreach performances for 2,000 students ages 5-18, at community sites and public venues throughout Miami Dade County. Program activities will include orchestral training, violin and percussion instruction for youth living in under-resourced communities, family-friendly concerts, and outreach performances for seniors. Participants will engage in music education and benefit from improved musical, social, and behavioral skills.

Grant #2 : Alliance for Musical Arts Productions, Inc. 5020 NW 197 ST Miami Gardens, Florida 33055

Funds are requested to support the Musical Arts Theater & Tutoring program for up to 50 participants ages 7-18, via ZOOM. Program activities will include the FIND YOUR BEAT! Series of Hambone, basic percussion and percussion with non-traditional instruments. articipants will engage in music/percussion training, and benefit from mastering the skills taught and the confidence of a lesson learned.

Grant #3 : American Children's Orchestras for Peace, Inc. 2150 Coral Way #3-C Miami, Florida 33145

Funds are requested to support American Children's Orchestras for Peace for over 800 students ages 5-17, at Jose Marti Park and Shenandoah Park, located in Little Havana. Program activities include afterschool classes at Bridgeprep School, round-year and summer orchestral music classes, and concert performances, where participants learn how to play a variety of musical instruments.

Grant #4 : Area Performance Gallery, Inc. dba Area Stage Company 5701 Sunset DR Suite 286 South Miami, Florida 33143

Funds are requested to support Area Stage Company's educational programs for 1,000 students ages 5-22, at the Area Stage Company in South Miami and the Adrienne Arsht Center for the Performing Arts in Miami. Program activities include a structured curriculum in the performing arts and a full season of large-scale productions for students of all abilities. Participants will enjoy the benefits of having the tools to innovate, to think creatively, to be accepting of others, and to appreciate diverse cultures and backgrounds.

Grant #5 : Armour Dance Theatre, Inc 5818 SW 73 ST South Miami, Florida 33143

Funds are requested to support Armour Dance Theater programming for 850 students ages 5-18, at five sites in South Miami, Little Haiti, West Coconut Grove, Miami Gardens, and West Perrine. Program activities will include instruction in ballet, tap, modern, hip hop, West African, and Bollywood. Participants will engage in dance, reading, and homework (math) assistance, and art classes. Skills learned include discipline, consistency, focus, delayed gratification and improved reading skills.

Grant #6 : Art Creates US Inc. dba ProjectArt 205 E 42 ST New York, New York 10017

Funds are requested to support ProjectArt Miami for 240 students ages 4-18, at multiple Miami-Dade Public Libraries. Program activities will include tuition-free art classes, nine-month professional residencies for emerging artists, and the presentation of two final exhibitions. Participants will engage with a variety of art materials in both 2D, 3D and digital projects, and benefit from increased literacy, self-esteem and problem-solving skills..

Grant #7 : Ballet Etudes of South Florida, Inc. 6812 NW 169 ST Hialeah, Florida 33015

Funds are requested to support Ballet Etudes for 250 students ages 3-22, at Ballet Etudes studio, Lou Rawls Center for the Performing Arts, City of Hialeah, Lehman Theater and more in Hialeah, Miami Lakes, and Miami Gardens. Program activities will include performances and dance training. Participants will engage in dance, especially classical ballet and benefit from discipline, focus, teamwork, performing, musicality, and physical conditioning.

Funds are requested to support after-school performing arts programs for 250 students ages 3-18, at BBharts in Hialeah. Grant #9 : Diva Arts & Entertainment, Inc. 4331 NW 194 ST Miami, Florida 33055

Funds are requested to support Diva Arts' Dance Empowers Youth Program for 150 students ages 5-19, at Diva Arts Dance Studio in Miami Gardens. Program activities will include dance training (e.g., ballet, contemporary, jazz, hip-hop), personal development, community outreach, and choreography. Students will master skills in dance technique and performance, improve socially and academically, and increase knowledge of health awareness and injury prevention.

Funds are requested to support enFAMILIA's arts programs for 300 students ages 6-18, year-round at the Everglades Community Center and enFAMILIA centers in Homestead and Florida City. Project activities will include singing, playing instruments, and movement.
